



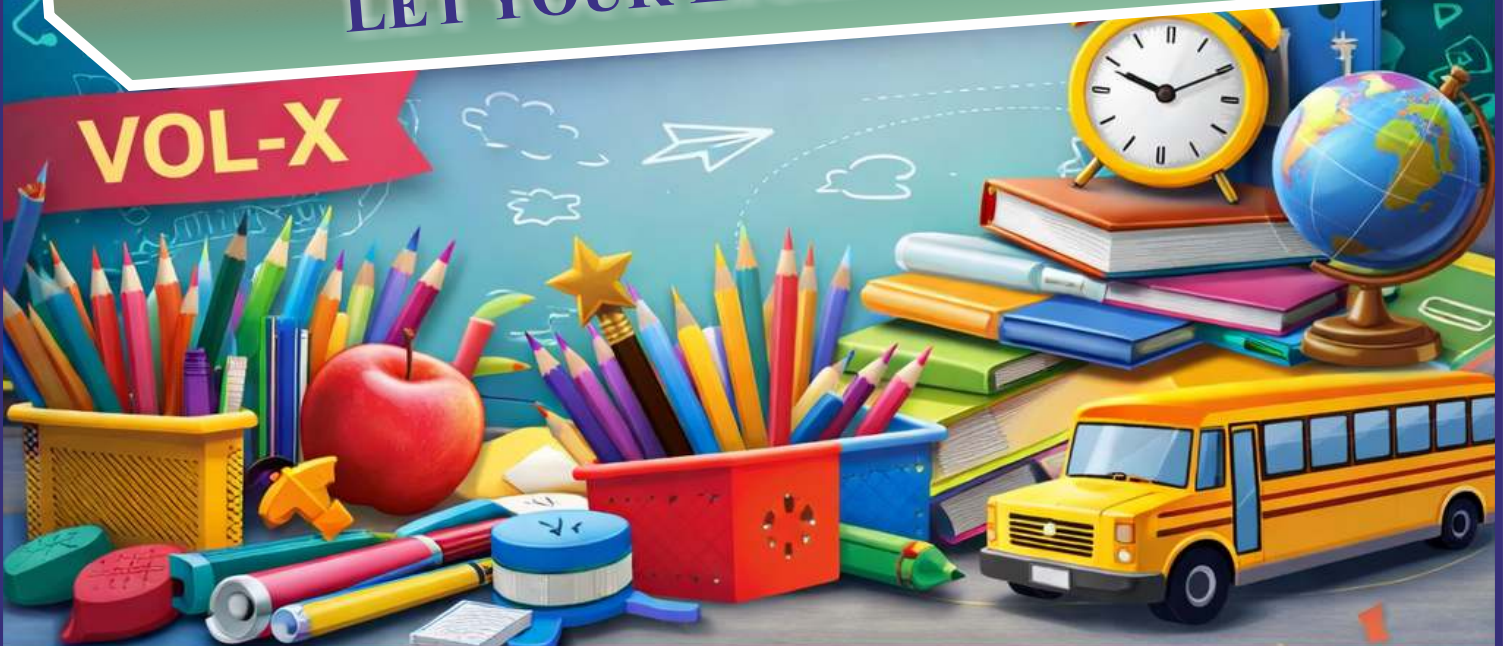

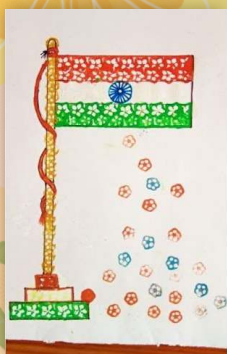
Tricolor printing with veggies.

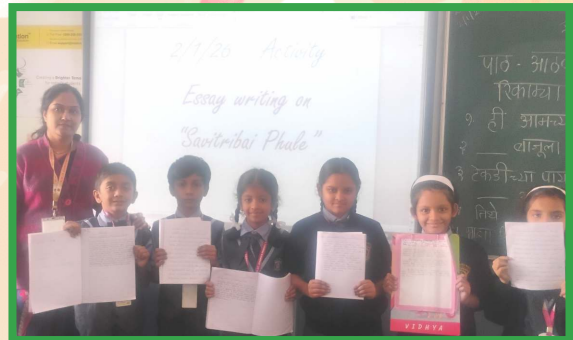
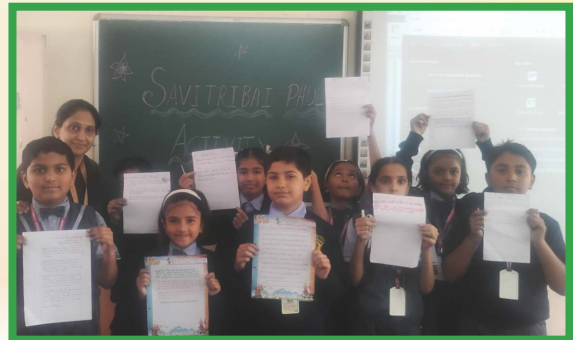
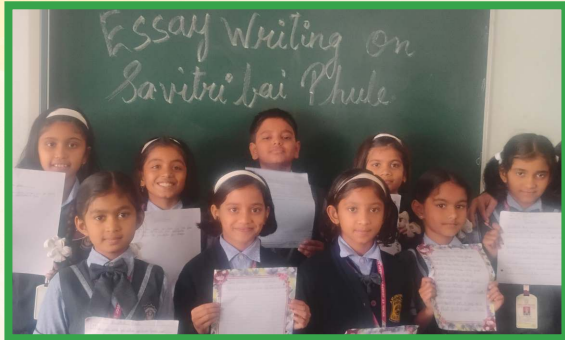
Savitribai Phule Content Creation

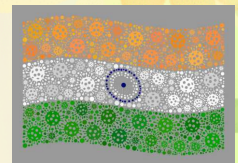
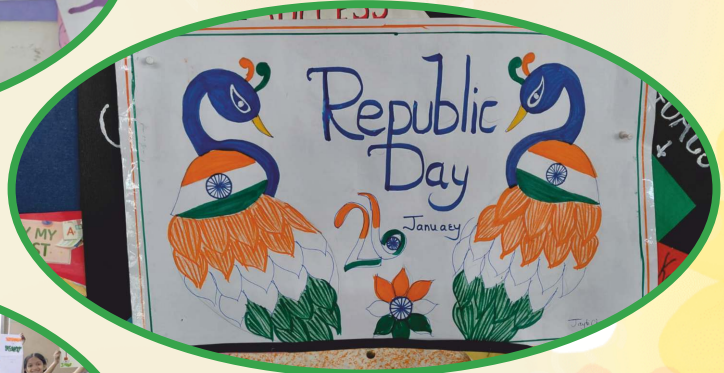
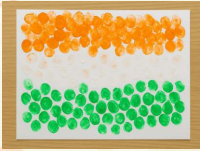
Patriotic Mosaic

Description: Students created beautiful and colorful cards for their grandparents with loving messages. The best cards were selected based on creativity, neatness, and presentation.



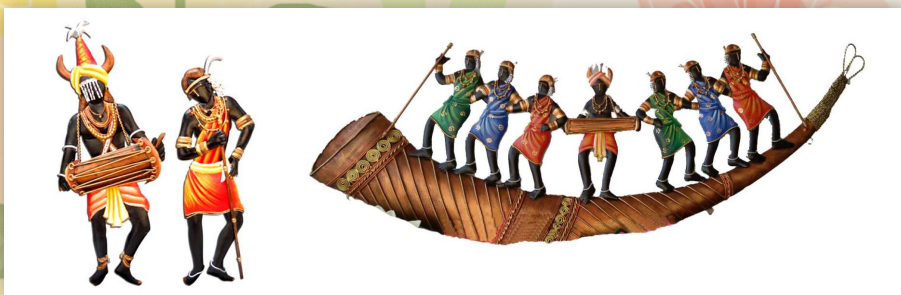
